Pastor's Column

Yesterday's text, the anointing of Jesus by Mary the sister of Lazarus, functions as a kind of invitation to Holy Week, to the practice of encountering the story's of Christ's passion in scripture, song and worship.

We pick up the story on Palm Sunday, this coming Sunday at 11 a.m., processing in to worship together and enacting that triumphal welcome into Jerusalem. But the liturgy doesn't let us treat this as the finale to the story; instead, we move, through the liturgy of the Passion, to the cross.

As the week progresses, we slow the story down. Maundy Thursday commemorates the Last Supper in the upper room, which we enact through the celebration of communion. Good Friday marks the crucifixion. Holy Saturday is a day of silence, but as the sun goes down Easter Vigil begins, and we welcome the light of Christ into the sanctuary. Easter Sunday we bear witness to the resurrection.

You are invited and encouraged to take part in this story, both by individual scripture reading and by participation in corporate worship. If you are following along in the biblical story, spend the week reading Luke 19:28-24:12. And please plan to join us for worship at the following times:

Palm/Passion Sunday: Sunday, April 10 at 11 a.m.
Maundy Thursday: Thursday, April 14 at 7 p.m.
Good Friday: Friday, April 15 at 7 p.m.
Easter Vigil: Saturday, April 16 at 7 p.m.

Easter Sunday: Sunday, April 17 at 11 a.m.


Memories of Early Cuban Exiles.

Holy scripture teaches us that God created humankind in god's own image. Christ calls us to love God, with all our mind, soul, and heart, and our neighbor as ourselves. With this comes the sacred responsibility to treat each human being with the love and respect due to a child of God.

We acknowledge the long history of systemic racism that, through violence, laws, policies, and their implementation, was intended to exclude persons who are not Caucasian from benefits and opportunities – from the first European settlers who considered themselves entitled to land and violently displaced indigenous people from their homes, to the equally long history of slavery which built the wealth of this country, to Jim Crow laws to current instances of police brutality and the overwhelming mass incarceration of people of color.

We declare ourselves utterly opposed to all forms of systemic racism. We are committed to standing with those who find themselves on the receiving end of any form of racism. We will seek out opportunities to oppose all forms of systematic racism and to ensure that black lives matter, as do those of indigenous, Asian, and Latinx people and persons of all colors or countries of origin.

Our faith tells us that we can do no less, if we truly affirm that all human beings are made in god's image.

We dream of a day in which all persons are treated as bearers of that image.
