Between Leo Sandon's memorial service and Palm/Passion Sunday, thank you for a weekend of worship that was by turns beautiful and poignant, joyful and sad-a witness to resurrection, and then to the passion that preceded it.

This Holy Week, we'll have a chance to experience that story in full. I'd encourage you to set aside some time, this week, to encounter this narrative, both in the text of scripture and in worship, as we mark the Last Supper on Maundy Thursday, the Crucifixion on Good Friday, the silence of Holy Saturday leading into the Easter Vigil, and then the Resurrection of Our Lord on Easter Sunday. Worship services are 7 p.m. on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, and at 11 a.m. on Sunday. All are livestreamed, with communion at every service except Good Friday.

Even as we experience this story together as a community of faith, we'll have a chance to welcome a new family into God's story through the sacrament of baptism. The James family (parents Kris and Caitlin, daughter Willa) are a preschool family who have made their way upstairs, joining us in worship on Sunday mornings (they, like the rest of us, already have a favorite pew, toward the back on the right-hand side). Caitlin loves to sew, and is a regular at Together in Service. We've been meeting together this Lent to talk about the sacrament of baptism and the meaning of membership, and this Saturday at the Easter Vigil service, we will receive Caitlin and Willa through baptism, and Kris through profession of faith.

Please plan to join us for worship at Easter Vigil in order to witness these baptisms, remember your own, and help answer the congregation's baptismal questions: "Do you, as members of the church of Jesus Christ, promise to guide and nurture the James family, by word and deed, with love and prayer?" and "Will you encourage them to know and follow Christ and to be faithful members of his church?" Then on Sunday morning, please come early-there will be an outdoor gathering in the playground at 10, with an egg hunt for kids and a chance to welcome the James family.

PS-Congratulations to Patsy Kickliter and all the singers and musicians who participated in Sunday's Palm Sunday Cantata at Westminster Oaks. I attended because I wanted to support our members who were singing and leading that day, but as I listened, I realized, oh, this is a time when I don't have to worry about what's coming next in worship-I get to simply participate and receive. It was a great gift as Holy Week begins.



### Presbyterian Women's Mission Workshop April 3, 2022

The 2022 Spring Mission Workshop was a beautiful afternoon of fellowship and generosity. After enjoying brown-bag lunches in the Church Courtyard and under the shaded walkway, 50 people gathered on Zoom and in the Westminster Room, masked and socially distanced and thrilled to be together again, working on projects to benefit some of those in need in our local community. Volunteers at sewing tables made lap blankets and baby burp cloths while others packaged socks for free distribution, designed Easter cards and friendship notes, collected flower seeds and vegetable seedlings to plant, and learned more about caring for creation.

But the three tables overflowing with donations of new and gently-used household and childrens' items for international refugee families here in Tallahassee put smiles on everyone's faces, especially our guest speaker, Karen Duncan, our local refugee coordinator for the IRC (International Rescue Committee). Together with those items, which included a brand new laptop computer for a refugee family, our generous congregation also gave \$1,000 in cash, checks and gift cards, which will all go to the refugee families. Holy scripture teaches us that God created humankind in god's own image. Christ calls us to love God, with all our mind, soul, and heart, and our neighbor as ourselves. With this comes the sacred responsibility to treat each human being with the love and respect due to a child of God.

We acknowledge the long history of systemic racism that, through violence, laws, policies, and their implementation, was intended to exclude persons who are not Caucasian from benefits and opportunities – from the first European settlers who considered themselves entitled to land and violently displaced indigenous people from their homes, to the equally long history of slavery which built the wealth of this country, to Jim Crow laws to current instances of police brutality and the overwhelming mass incarceration of people of color.

We declare ourselves utterly opposed to all forms of systemic racism. We are committed to standing with those who find themselves on the receiving end of any form of racism. We will seek out opportunities to oppose all forms of systematic racism and to ensure that black lives matter, as do those of indigenous, Asian, and Latinx people and persons of all colors or countries of origin.

Our faith tells us that we can do no less, if we truly affirm that all human beings are made in god's image.

We dream of a day in which all persons are treated as bearers of that image.
