


The reader offers a phrase to mark the end of each reading, such as, The Word of the Lord, or Holy Wisdom, Holy Word. The assembly responds, **Thanks be to God.**

The hymn sung immediately before the reading of the Gospel is called the **Gradual**, or **Gradual Hymn**, which refers to the step (Latin gradus) from which it was chanted in medieval church practice.

After the reading of the Gospel the reader says, The Gospel of the Lord. The assembly responds, **Praise be to you, O Christ.**

The **Nicene Creed** is a 4th century statement of faith shared by most Christian denominations.


