














AN AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CONGREGATION AND THE DEPARTING PASTOR

1. With a posture of grace, understanding, and trusting in the guidance of the Holy Spirit we all agree to:

- hold one another in prayer, and
- refrain from all intentional pastoral interaction in person or online.

2. The Congregation agrees to:

- pray for the well-being of the departing pastor into retirement or a new call;
- have this agreement read during a worship service when a ministerial vacancy occurs and also communicate it through the newsletter (if there is one) and through email;
- once the departing pastor has left, to no longer approach the departed pastor or the departed pastor's family regarding issues of pastoral care, congregational life, or future pastoral leadership;
- welcome and embrace new pastoral leadership and joyfully engage in a process of discerning God's calling for their future; and
- allow those who are feeling a sense of loss to have adequate time to grieve the end of the departing pastor's relationship with the congregation.

3. The Departing Pastor agrees to:

- pray for the well-being of the congregation as individuals and as the gathered community;
- allow time to grieve the end of a pastoral and congregational relationship;
- participate in the life of the larger church;
- maintain healthy boundaries, refrain from and discourage any interactions regarding issues of pastoral care, congregational life, or future pastoral leadership;
- communicate to the entire congregation, friends of the church, and staff so it is clear that although the departing pastor has valued their friendships, the pastor desires and has agreed to not be in communication regarding congregational life, any pastoral care matters, or discussion of future leadership, congregational issues or events, or the new pastor;
- refrain from attending worship services or other events of his/her former church until one year after the installation of the new pastor, unless there are extenuating circumstances; and
- decline pastoral participation by former church members in any funerals, baptisms, counseling, weddings, etc., of his/her former church unless invited by the interim pastor or the new installed pastor.

When a pastor/associate pastor requests that the presbytery dissolve the relationship with the current congregation, the congregation of that church moves into a stage of transition.


In yesterday's sermon, I summarized our time together. I won't repeat that here. Just to say: even though my tenure with you has been short, the joy I've taken in this place and in this congregation is very real. You have pushed and challenged me to grow. Going forward, I'll be abiding by the presbytery's covenant of separation for departing pastors, which means I'll no longer be available to discuss church-related matters or to provide pastoral care. One of the things I was most grateful for when arriving in this place was your openness to and availability for new pastoral relationship. I know that you'll extend that same welcome to your next pastor when he or she arrives, and for this to happen successfully, our pastoral relationship will need to come to an end. Last week, the Session met with the Rev. Dr. Roy Martin, Jr., General Presbyter of the Presbytery of Florida, Rev. Lisa Martin, Chair of the Congregational Revitalization Committee, and Linda Shelley, our Pastoral Transition Liaison, to discuss next steps for recruiting and hiring an interim pastor.

While we are searching, pulpit supply pastors will lead our worship services. The Worship Team will be arranging for guest preachers and engaging the congregation in welcoming them to our church. This coming Sunday, June 19, 2022, Rev. Dr. Roy Martin, Jr. will preach and lead worship.

The Presbytery has assigned the Reverend Sheldon Steen, Pastor at Christ Presbyterian Church, Tallahassee, to serve as moderator of our Session until an interim pastor takes over. Reverend Steen will be presiding over our next session meeting that is scheduled for June 22nd. Our search process will begin with election of an interim pastor search committee. That will happen soon. The Session discussed nominating 5 members, including some who currently serve on Session and some who do not.

The search committee will undertake the search process with Linda Shelley's assistance and in coordination with the Presbytery. While a permanent minister is called and installed by the congregation, an interim pastor is hired by the Session after the approval of the candidate by the Presbytery. We will continue to provide you updates on the interim pastor search process throughout the summer.





We deeply appreciate our Choral Scholars, but the students who were with us during 2020-2022 deserve extra thanks: they had to pivot from being section leaders to being worship leaders when the choir could not gather in person, and then pivoted again when we resumed regular rehearsals. Sunday, June 5 was going to be Serenna Jones's last day with us, but travel complications prevented her from being here. Please join us in thanking Serenna, congratulating her for completing her Master's program at Florida State, and expressing the hope that she will always feel she has a church home in Tallahassee.

Due to a change in Florida law, Supervisor of Elections Mark S. Earley is contacting some voters by mail asking for information missing from your voter registration record. This is not junk mail!

According to the Supervisor's website, there is no deadline for submission of the information, but your Healing Racism Task Force wants to encourage you to comply. It is important to make sure that our Supervisor of Elections office is not vulnerable to unfounded allegations of fraud or voting irregularities, and it is always important to protect your right to vote.


