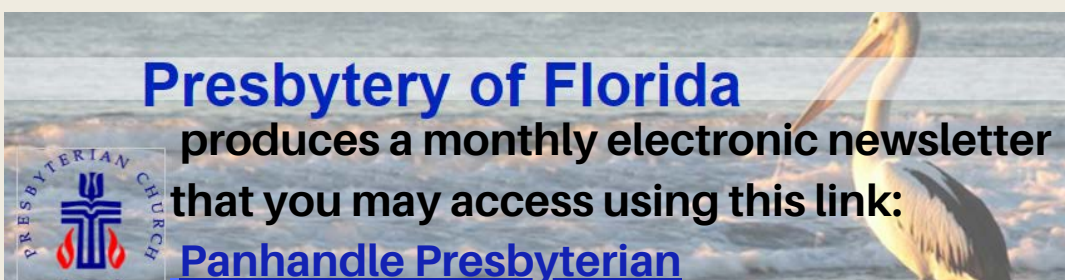

At its August meeting the session voted to accept a proposal to establish a “Michael Corzine Music Education Fund” in honor of Michael Corzine's lengthy music ministry with our congregation. The fund will have the goal of encouraging and nurturing students who are considering a call to service as church musicians. It will further this goal by providing opportunities for those students to participate in worship and music in ways that will both support their call and enrich the worship life of this congregation. One of the themes we heard repeatedly from those who spoke at Michael's retirement celebration was his nurture and mentoring of students, and this provides a fitting way to celebrate Michael by continuing something he supported so strongly.

Once the fund has accumulated a sufficient amount, proceeds will be available for either recurring or one-time expenditures relating to the music program of our congregation, as long as those expenditures are consistent with the goal of the fund. Examples of possible uses of the fund would be hiring an organ or music performance student to play in worship; hiring a music student to conduct the choir at a particular service; hiring a student to work with a group of children or youth; supporting a student's participation in a conference such as a Montreat Worship and Music Conference; or hiring a student to complete a specific administrative project relating to the worship and music program at First Church under the supervision of the organist and/or choir master.

The fund will be managed by the session in consultation with the Endowment Management Committee (EMC), consistent with the Legacy and Gifts Plan adopted in 2022.

Rev. Dr. Claudio Carvalhaes.

Cláudio Carvalhaes, earth thinker, theologian, liturgist and artist, a native Brazilian, completed his Ph.D. in Liturgy and Theology at Union Theological Seminary in New York City in 2007. He earned his first Master of Philosophy degree in Theology, Philosophy, and History at the Methodist University of Sao Paulo in 1997 and a Master of Divinity degree from the Independent Presbyterian Theological Seminary (Sao Paulo, Brazil) in 1992.

In the summer of 2016, Dr. Carvalhaes joined Union Theological Seminary in New York City as the Associate Professor of Worship. Previously, he taught at McCormick Theological Seminary, Lutheran Theological Seminary in Philadelphia and Louisville Presbyterian Theological Seminary. Carvalhaes is an ordained pastor within the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.).

A much sought after speaker, writer and performer, Carvalhaes preached at the Festival of Homiletics, Academy of Homiletics, Wild Goose Festival, Proctor Institute for Child Advocacy Ministry, Jubilee 800 Order of Preachers of the Dominican Order in Italy, Societas Liturgica in Belgium, Council of World Mission in Mexico, International Academy of Practical Theology in Brazil, at the Forum of Liturgics and Ethics at Hildesheim Germany and other places. He led worship for the All African Council of Churches in Mozambique, taught at the Global Institute of Theology of the World Communion of Reformed Churches, and leads worship and teaches at the Hispanic Summer Program since 2013.

When you enter the Park, give your name and let them know you are a part of First Presbyterian's Family Picnic, and the Care and Outreach Ministry will cover your entrance fee. You will then proceed to the first road to the right where you will see the sign for the swimming and picnic area. In front of you at the end of the road is the lake and the pavilion is to your left behind the playground. Park in the large parking lot located at the end of the road.

This year we'll be reinstating our potluck sides along with fried chicken from Lindy's! We are looking forward to some of our traditional potluck favorites! We will have a table set-up after church for the picnic sign-up. The chicken will cost \$3 per person with no more than \$10 per family. 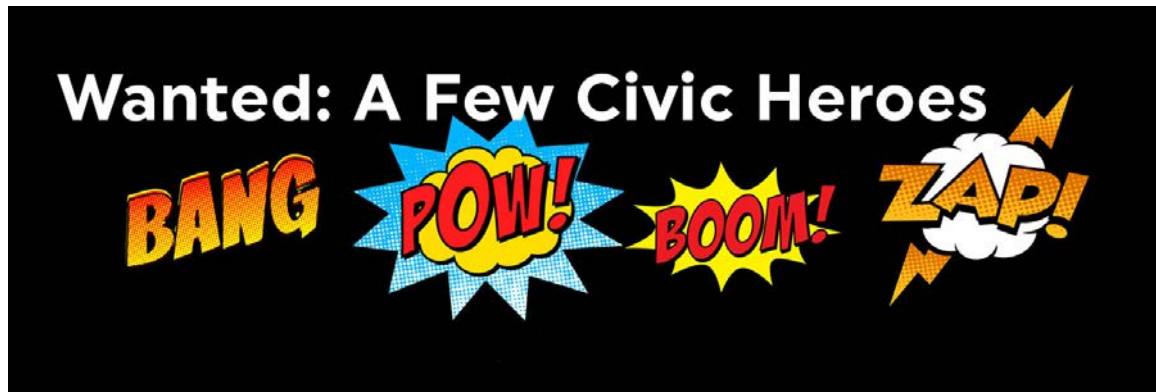

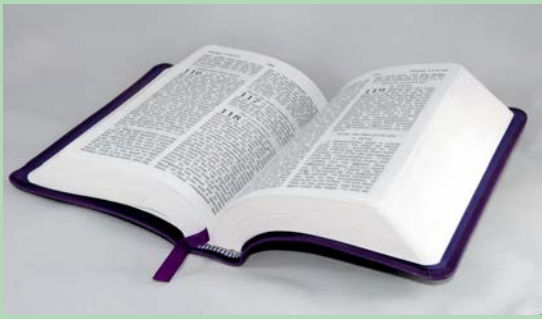

We will seek out opportunities to oppose all forms of systematic racism and to ensure that black lives matter, as do those of indigenous, Asian, and Latinx people and persons of all colors or countries of origin. Our faith tells us that we can do no less, if we truly affirm that all human beings are made in god's image.

We dream of a day in which all persons are treated as bearers of that image.

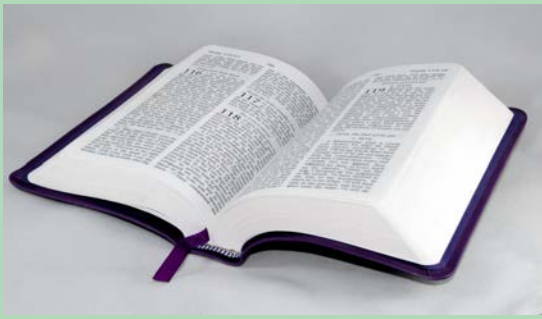
