

Sunday September 25, 2022

Topic: "Justice in the Torah"

Presenter: Steven T. Mindlin

Steven Mindlin is a native of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. He graduated from Haverford College with a B.A. in Religion, earning honors in the Religion Department. His undergraduate thesis, analyzing the first references to the book Acts of the Apostles in the writings of the early fathers of the emerging Christian Church, may be the most sleep-inducing treatise ever committed to paper. That so many trees gave their lives to that endeavor seems highly unjust.

Steve received his Juris Doctor degree with honors from the University of Miami School of Law in Coral Gables, Florida. Steve has lived in Tallahassee since 1986 and has been and continues to be active in numerous civic and community organizations, including Board service at Temple Israel, Congregation Shomrei Torah, the Alzheimer's Project of Tallahassee, Big Bend Hospice, and the Tallahassee Symphony Orchestra.

In our session on 9/25, we will "speak of justice" and welcome the start of a new year on the Jewish calendar by looking into Justice as it appears in the Torah. We will consider some important biblical texts appearing in the Hebrew Bible relating to justice and will study some sections on the same topic from the Babylonian Talmud. We will also attempt to gain insight together on some questions that we think we already know the answers to, but may in fact not, such as: What is Justice? What is Torah? And what does Torah have to offer Christians and Jews in the modern world when it comes to defining, creating, and living justice in our lives and our community?



We will seek out opportunities to oppose all forms of systematic racism and to ensure that black lives matter, as do those of indigenous, Asian, and Latinx people and persons of all colors or countries of origin.

Our faith tells us that we can do no less, if we truly affirm that all human beings are made in god's image.

We dream of a day in which all persons are treated as bearers of that image.
