

The French philosopher, Fénelon advised, "Accustom yourself to remain at peace in the depth of your heart, in spite of your restless imagination." Theologian Howard Thurman muses on this phrase in a simple reflection found in his book, <u>The Inward Journey</u>. Thurman wonders if "the stirring of energy in myriad forms of unstructured malevolences may well be the spirit of Life, of God at work in behalf of new life and perhaps a new creation on this planet."

Scripture certainly poses places where we see God at work on behalf of new life in what seems to be unstructured malevolences. During last Sunday's Inquirer's Class examining "tension," we looked at artistic renderings of Hagar in the Wilderness. Reading the stories of Hagar, tension is found along the line between faith and fear. When she seems at her wits end in chapters 16 and 18 from Genesis, Hagar encounters angels of the Lord who ask probing questions.

Where have you come from? Where are you going? What troubles you?

Hagar is embittered with Sarai. Hagar feels unseen by God. Hagar pleads, "Do not let me look upon the death of my child." One of the images we examined of the figures of Hagar and Ishmael, before the well of water appears. Mother and child in the parched land. Raw vulnerability radiated from the image. One class member observed, "There is no water there. Without water, there is no possibility for life." The way the Holy Spirit works in me is rooted in Scripture. I have asked the question of congregants, "How would you describe the last two years at First Presbyterian?" A common metaphor of response is "wandering in the wilderness." In the tension of the last two years, I hear the Spirit calling through those three questions.

Where have you come from? Where are you going? What troubles you?

Those questions are good ones to connect with our baptismal calling. They are grounding questions which can lead to the strengthening of disciples for service with Christ and strengthening the mission of First Presbyterian Church. I believe that God is calling us to find that strength, and that reflecting through these three textual questions asked of Hagar can help us find a new way in God. The first is a reflective question, the second is a forward-looking question, and the third asks for an honest response to where God's grace seems absent. I hope you might prayerfully consider these questions through a lens of Christ's calling upon your life of service as a disciple at First.

And, a few technical remarks. Apparently - it's football season. Tom Brady showed up in the friendship register! Thank you for listening, the gift of playful humor, and understanding a little bit about why those registers are important for the life of the church. We will have a new member joining! 
Holy scripture teaches us that God created humankind in god's own image. Christ calls us to love God, with all our mind, soul, and heart, and our neighbor as ourselves. With this comes the sacred responsibility to treat each human being with the love and respect due to a child of God.

We acknowledge the long history of systemic racism that, through violence, laws, policies, and their implementation, was intended to exclude persons who are not Caucasian from benefits and opportunities from the first European settlers who considered themselves entitled to land and violently displaced indigenous people from their homes, to the equally long history of slavery which built the wealth of this country, to Jim Crow laws to current instances of police brutality and the overwhelming mass incarceration of people of color.

We declare ourselves utterly opposed to all forms of systemic racism. We are committed to standing with those who find themselves on the receiving end of any form of racism. We will seek out opportunities to oppose all forms of systematic racism and to ensure that black lives matter, as do those of indigenous, Asian, and Latinx people and persons of all colors or countries of origin.

Our faith tells us that we can do no less, if we truly affirm that all human beings are made in god's image.

We dream of a day in which all persons are treated as bearers of that image.


