Pastor's Message Rev. Anne H.K. Apple

Last Wednesday, the Westminster Oaks chapel service was a delight. Harriet Chase played the piano, and Chaplain Taylor Phillips reminded the gathered congregation of the power of stories, some that often go untold. Later that evening he was having a book launch for his book, *Queen of the Clouds*, which tells the story of two women pilots, Jerrie Mock and Joan Merriam Smith, and their epic quest to fly solo around the world.

As the new month begins this week, so does the 6th month of the interim season. Compassionate witnessing has "launched" and the elders have begun that faithful work and a large part of compassionate witnessing is storytelling. This process will begin to roll into the congregation. In addition, the work of many administrative details are going on behind the scenes. Pictures are being taken for a new pictorial directory and if you come by church, there is a new doorbell installed on the left side of the door frame to the education building. Look up! It might seem silly to name a doorbell as an accomplishment, and yet - small things matter - like details in stories.

After worship at Westminster Oaks, Wayne Largent introduced himself and said, "I have a story for you!" Never having met Wayne before, I wasn't sure where the connection would be made. He pulled out an envelope, a card, and a church bulletin from May 6, 1951. Seventy two years ago this week! Lawrence I. Stell was the minister. Hotel Duval was constructed that year in 188 days and opened in advance of the legislature convening. These were the years right before the Tallahassee Bus Boycott.

At that time, post WWII, there were two morning services and an evening service. The church had a bi-cameral form of leadership - a board of deacons and a Session. And, both groups were all male. The PC(USA) didn't even exist. First Presbyterian was part of the Southern Presbyterian Church. The stories. Oh, the stories about the church, her people, and how change unfolds across time. On Sunday, I shared Rachel Held Evans words, "The church is not a group of people who believe all the same things; the church is a group of people caught up in the same story, with Jesus at the center."

Thanks be to God for our story together with Jesus at the center!




The State of Florida plans to execute Darryl Barwick on Wednesday, May 3, at 6 pm. We have one week to do everything we can to stop this execution. Urge Governor DeSantis and the Florida Board of Executive Clemency to stay the execution – sign and share the petition. Help us reach 10,000 signatures for Darryl.

The non-unanimity bill, SB 450, is now headed to Governor DeSantis to be signed into law. There is still time to stop the most extreme death penalty bill in the country from becoming law. Take action now. Contact Governor DeSantis and urge him to VETO SB 450.

Holy scripture teaches us that God created humankind in god's own image. Christ calls us to love God, with all our mind, soul, and heart, and our neighbor as ourselves. With this comes the sacred responsibility to treat each human being with the love and respect due to a child of God.

We acknowledge the long history of systemic racism that, through violence, laws, policies, and their implementation, was intended to exclude persons who are not Caucasian from benefits and opportunities from the first European settlers who considered themselves entitled to land and violently displaced indigenous people from their homes, to the equally long history of slavery which built the wealth of this country, to Jim Crow laws to current instances of police brutality and the overwhelming mass incarceration of people of color.

We declare ourselves utterly opposed to all forms of systemic racism. We are committed to standing with those who find themselves on the receiving end of any form of racism. We will seek out opportunities to oppose all forms of systematic racism and to ensure that black lives matter, as do those of indigenous, Asian, and Latinx people and persons of all colors or countries of origin.

Our faith tells us that we can do no less, if we truly affirm that all human beings are made in god's image.

We dream of a day in which all persons are treated as bearers of that image.
