# Pastor's Message Rev. Anne H.K. Apple

As you will read later in a letter from our kind editor, Kathee Winstead, she will retire from her ministry of producing the newsletter at the end of this month. When Kathee first told me about her plans early in my tenure at First, she also described how she had intended for this ending to occur earlier, and yet – all the things of being church kept unfolding. It was as if there wasn't space to step out of the role, or take a breath, because of the pace and need for communication about First Church. Please join me in thanking God, and Kathee, for her faithful service throughout the years; for helping our congregation to know about the life and ministries of First Presbyterian through her faithful witness to service. The newsletter has been the primary communication tool for years.

The Personnel Ministry Team has applied for a Thriving Congregations grant which will help us as we envision a comprehensive communications plan moving forward. Things will look different in the interim time, so thank you in advance for your patience as we bring a new vision forward.

As this ending transpires with Kathee, we also are at another beginning.

First Presbyterian Church, Tallahassee, will host a pastoral intern this Summer, a rising Senior from Davidson College. We will welcome Ellie Stewart, (They, Them). Ellie will serve this internship as an opportunity for full exploration of the Ministry of Word and Sacrament from June 12th – August 18th. They will preach three times, work with Christian Formation, attend Session meetings, practice pastoral care and visitation in homes and hospitals, and explore Sabbath practices. Ellie's internship will be supported by an internship prayer group who will meet regularly to assist to build a regular practice for action and reflection to assist in their discernment for ordained ministry.

I first met Ellie Stewart, as a young elementary student. Their father was a deacon and mother a ruling elder of the congregation I was serving in Memphis, Tennessee, Idlewild Presbyterian Church. I had the privilege of being one of three associate pastors who got to watch and to participate as Ellie's faith was developing from a young child into adolescence. They have ways been actively involved in worship, program, and leadership - inquisitive and curious in a way that rings with integrity. Attending a high school with Baptist affiliations and being an active member of a PC(USA) congregation left them lots of space for questioning and seeking. I look forward to watching their continued growth as they explore ministry in Tallahassee this Summer! # Are you concerned about the pervasive gun violence in our country? Would you like to do something concrete to get guns off the street?



On June 10 from 10:00 until noon, a group of 8 local churches will join with churches nationwide for a safe surrender event in conjunction with the <a href="Presbyterian Peace">Presbyterian Peace</a>
<a href="Fellowship">Fellowship</a> and <a href="RawTools">RawTools</a>. Our local event will be hosted by Good Shepherd Catholic Church and co-sponsored by the Leon County Sheriff's Department.

Participants bring guns that they no longer want or use--unloaded and in the trunk of their car. After being inspected by a deputy to assure its safety, the gun will be dismantled using a chop saw ensuring that it can never be used to harm anyone again. The metal will be sent to RawTools which will forge it into garden tools and an instrument of death will be transformed into a tool that promotes life. Those surrendering weapons will be given a gift card as a thank you for disposing of their unwanted guns.

ACTS 17:22-31 AND PSALM 66:8-20 OR EZEKIEL 34:1-7 AND PSALM 115 1 PETER 3:13-22 JOHN 14:15-21





Holy scripture teaches us that God created humankind in god's own image. Christ calls us to love God, with all our mind, soul, and heart, and our neighbor as ourselves. With this comes the sacred responsibility to treat each human being with the love and respect due to a child of God.

We acknowledge the long history systemic racism that, through violence, laws, policies, and their implementation, was intended to exclude persons who are not Caucasian from benefits and opportunities from the first European settlers who considered themselves entitled to land and violently displaced indigenous people from their homes, to the equally long history of slavery which built the wealth of this country, to Jim Crow laws to current instances of police brutality overwhelming mass incarceration of people of color.

We declare ourselves utterly opposed to all forms of systemic racism. We are committed to standing with those who find themselves on the receiving end of any form of racism. We will seek out opportunities to oppose all forms of systematic racism and to ensure that black lives matter, as do those of indigenous, Asian, and Latinx people and persons of all colors or countries of origin.

Our faith tells us that we can do no less, if we truly affirm that all human beings are made in god's image.

We dream of a day in which all persons are treated as bearers of that image.
