# Pastor's Message Rev. Anne H.K. Apple

Dear First Presbyterian Family,

On Sunday, we will sing a hymn that I first learned in college singing with the Rhodes College Singers, *Fight the Good Fight*. The version we sang in college had this rolling tenor line that showed the movement of God in the world. The verse that accompanied that tenor line, "Feint not nor fear: God's arms are near.

God changeth not, and thou art dear."

Even as I type, I can still hear those tenors from over 35 years ago. The language is formal, and mired in the King James, and also faithfully resonant of words from First Peter, "whoever serves must do so with the strength God supplies." In Anne-speak, with the Spirit's help, I hear, "Do not be afraid - God's faithfulness has this. Just serve with the gifts I have given to you. It is enough."

I'd like to share a word of gratitude to Glenn Hodges who served very faithfully in my absence last week with several hospitalizations of members and even a last minute memorial service on Saturday. Glenn's witness points to the ways I see that he trusts that God's arms are near, and especially the ways he serves out of God's strength. In addition, I'd like to share gratitude for the Personnel Ministry Team led by active elder, Carol Grondzik. In the staff transition with the Financial Administrator, the team worked together to seek a solution. This week we will welcome a new part time administrator, Fran Owens, who will work closely with the Treasurer, active elder, David Strange, and the newly formed Budget and Finance Ministry Team. Are you concerned about the pervasive gun violence in our country? Would you like to do something concrete to get guns off the street?



On June 10 from 10:00 until noon, a group of 8 local churches will join with churches nationwide for a safe surrender event in conjunction with the <u>Presbyterian Peace</u> <u>Fellowship</u> and <u>RawTools</u>. Our local event will be hosted by Good Shepherd Catholic Church and co-sponsored by the Leon County Sheriff's Department.

Participants bring guns that they no longer want or use--unloaded and in the trunk of their car. After being inspected by a deputy to assure its safety, the gun will be dismantled using a chop saw ensuring that it can never be used to harm anyone again. The metal will be sent to RawTools which will forge it into garden tools and an instrument of death will be transformed into a tool that promotes life. Those surrendering weapons will be given a gift card as a thank you for disposing of their unwanted guns.

In order for our event to be successful, we will need people to join us on the day of the event. Training will be provided for all participants. Volunteers are needed to be:

#### MAY 21, **2023** SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

Holy scripture teaches us that God created humankind in god's own image. Christ calls us to love God, with all our mind, soul, and heart, and our neighbor as ourselves. With this comes the sacred responsibility to treat each human being with the love and respect due to a child of God.

We acknowledge the long history of systemic racism that, through violence, laws, policies, and their implementation, was intended to exclude persons who are not Caucasian from benefits and opportunities the first European settlers who from considered themselves entitled to land and violently displaced indigenous people from their homes, to the equally long history of slavery which built the wealth of this country, to Jim Crow laws to current instances of police brutality and the overwhelming mass incarceration of people of color.

We declare ourselves utterly opposed to all forms of systemic racism. We are committed to standing with those who find themselves on the receiving end of any form of racism. We will seek out opportunities to oppose all forms of systematic racism and to ensure that black lives matter, as do those of indigenous, Asian, and Latinx people and persons of all colors or countries of origin.

Our faith tells us that we can do no less, if we truly affirm that all human beings are made in god's image.

We dream of a day in which all persons are treated as bearers of that image.
