

# Pastoral Note

Worship this Sunday will consist of a hymn sing. Congregation members were asked to submit a list of three favorite hymns. The choir will lead the congregation in singing a selection of favorites. At the heart of the hymn sing is the beautiful act of coming together as a congregation to sing and proclaim our faith. Apostle Paul, in his epistles, emphasizes the importance of unity, suggesting that the true beauty of the church envisioned by Jesus is realized when we lift our voices in song together. He writes, "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly; teach and admonish one another in all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God (Colossians 3:16-17)." As we gather on the Sabbath, we join as one body and praise God with one voice.

Singing engages the whole person and helps unite the body of Christ in common worship. Our inhibitions may keep us from acknowledging it, but music calls our whole body into motion. According to the Book of Order, the congregation is the church's primary choir; the purpose of choirs and other musicians is to lead and support the congregation in the singing of prayer (W-2.0202). Singing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs is a vital and ancient form of prayer. Memorable songs, anthems, and instrumental music may also interpret the Word and enhance the congregation's prayer.

We are thankful for the fine musicians leading us in the hymn sing. Elizabeth LaJeunesse, who plays our Baroque Taylor and Moody organ, and Ethan Murphy, Choir Director, have been instrumental in planning the hymn sing. If you are viewing the worship on YouTube, the hymn music will be part of the document uploaded with the bulletin, and you can access the hymns by opening the bulletin.
