Pastoral Note

This is the second pastor's note in a series on worship. The Presbyterian order of worship is faithful to the witness of Scripture. At the same time, there are no standards governing service ordering. The Directory of Worship in the Book of Order (BO) presents standards and norms for worship in congregations of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). According to the BO, the order of worship offered for the Service for the Lord's Day is rooted in Scripture, the tradition of the universal Church, and our Reformed heritage.

The Book of Common Worship (BCW), "Worship is at the heart of the church's life. All that the church is and does is rooted in its worship. The community of faith, gathered in response to God's call, is formed in its worship. Worship is the principal influence that shapes our faith and is the most visible way we express the faith." Liturgy is the service of God offered by the people of God in divine worship. The order of worship consists of rites, rubrics, patterns, words, and direction in "The Service for the Lord's Day." The order for "The Service for the Lord's Day" consists of four successive actions:

Gathering: Worship begins with God. God takes the initiative, calling us together. Or first act of worship is to heed God's call and join others in praising God. We praise God in Scripture, prayer, and song, acknowledging our sinfulness and receiving God's declaration of forgiveness.

The Word (Proclaiming)*: The congregation hears the Scriptures read and the message proclaimed. The congregation may sing psalms, hymns, spirituals, or anthems between scripture readings. Where the Word is read and proclaimed, Jesus Christ, the living Word, is present by the power of the Holy Spirit. Reading, hearing, and preaching are essentials to worship. The use of song, drama, dance, and visual art enhances the proclamation of the Word.

The Eucharist (Responding)*: Thanksgiving in Greek means Eucharist, or ecumenically, the Sacrament of Holy Communion. Holy Communion or the Lord's Supper is a koinonia (fellowship) by the people of God with one another at the Table with Christ as their host.

It emphasizes the congregation's spiritual relationship with Christ, whose presence is given in the sacrament. On noncommunion occasions, "the Eucharist" contains affirmation of faith, offerings, prayer of thanksgiving, and the Lord's Prayer.

The Sending: This final section of the worship includes singing a final hymn and receiving the charge and the blessing. In a sense, this is a gathering to return to the world. We are entrusted to keep the faith as we go out into the world with the promise of God's support.
