This Week: Two Cents-a-Meal Sunday

Many of you made two cents-a-meal containers at our October intergenerational Church School class, or perhaps you were given one of the beautiful containers made by our elementary class students. These students will be outside the church to receive your two cents-a-meal offerings as you come to church on November 9. We're grateful for their participation in this important mission!

Two Cents-a-Meal began fifty years ago when Rosellyn Calvert, a Presbyterian woman in Titusville, FL, and her family were undergoing extreme financial difficulties. After a layoff, her family of three had \$1.00 a day for food. While trying to find a way her family could help the people in Bangladesh, she realized they could give 2 cents a day and still make a sizeable impact. She sent the money and an explanation to the office of the PCUS. It was adopted by her presbytery and quickly spread across the nation, becoming an important part of the Presbyterian Hunger Program.

Through giving a few cents at mealtimes we can express thanks for what we have received and remember that, while we are blessed with food, others go hungry.

Recap: CAIM-FPC Justice Ministry Luncheon

We had our Capital Area Justice Ministry meeting after worship on Sunday, October 12. This was a time of fellowship, sharing and discovery! We named some of our concerns about our community and learned that many are shared, i.e, safety from gun violence, fear of losing healthcare, discomfort with promotion of ideas and actions that diminish democracy, prevalence of hunger, homelessness, unemployment, and affordable housing.

These issues were shared by our justice ministry members at the October 28, CAJM Nation—Network Assembly. Other CAJM members shared as well! In addition to issues already being addressed by the CAJM network, i.e. affordable housing, gun violence, and food insecurity, we are including mental health and immigration.
