Gathering to Worship, Reaching Out to Serve:

Highlighting the work of First Pres

This column provides descriptions of many of the projects that First Pres and its members undertake at the church, both within our congregation and in our wider community.

Wednesday Unhoused Ministry

Each week, a dedicated team of volunteers meets on Wednesday morning for two hours to provide up to 12 showers, 4 or 5 loads of laundry, and around 30 snack packs to our unsheltered neighbors.

We have also provided space for Tori Stevenson, the outreach coordinator for the Big Bend Continuum of Care, to provide services for those who are in need. She comes to the Westminster Room each Wednesday at 11:00 and stays for an hour or as long as she is needed. In the last year, she has obtained many FL DMV IDs, driver's licenses, and birth certificates for people, which are some of the first pieces of information required to get a job, housing, and other things we take for granted. She has helped several of our friends secure employment, even conducting mock interviews to build confidence. She has been able to help at least four people acquire housing, with others placed on waiting lists. She has provided shoes, clothes, tents, backpacks, tarps, lanterns, bug spray, bus passes and toiletries for many. We are lucky to work in conjunction with Tori and thank her for her efforts on behalf of our unsheltered friends!
