Join us on second Sundays from 4-6 PM.





Rev. Izett Sama Hernandez has shared a series of meditations for this Advent season with a special focus on celebrating in the home. The text for the First Week of Advent is Matthew 24:44 — "The Son of Man will come when you least expect it."

Knowing how to wait strengthens faith, renews hope, leaves marks on those around us. Since we do not know the day, nor the hour, nor the way in which the Lord will come to us, the invitation this week is to prepare ourselves to receive all people who arrive as if it were the Lord themself.

- 1.On Sunday, gather the whole family to decorate the house as if expecting guests. You can make simple ornaments, such as paper flowers, small decorations with dry leaves or other available materials, and place them on windows, doors, the front entrance.
- 2. You may place a sign that says "You are welcome in this home."
- 3. Also prepare some small cards with words of welcome, Bible verses, or quotes with hopeful messages.
- 4. If possible, you can prepare each day some tea, an infusion, coffee. During the whole week, make yourself ready to receive in a special way all the people who come to your door—whether known or not. May each person feel that you receive them as if they were the Lord themself. You may share one of the cards, read a biblical text, or say a prayer. Always try to say goodbye with a hug, a smile, a confirmation of how important and special every human being is; help hope to be reborn, renewed, or strengthened in each of the people who come to your home. At the end of the week, have a time of reflection with your family, friends, or neighbors about the experience lived during the week.
