Restoration and Healing Through the Lombard Mennonite Peace Center Process Begins

The Session has engaged the Lombard Mennonite Peace Center to lead the congregation through a restorative process and invites your participation. The process includes three key components: an educational workshop, a listening process, and a restorative circle.

The educational workshop, titled *Healthy Church Habits*, will be held on Saturday, January 31, from 9 AM to 4 PM and will include lunch. Childcare will also be provided. Please mark your calendar.

The listening process will have two distinct components to gather member input on the church's future direction.

- The first is an electronic questionnaire, available to the right. The church office will have printed copies available to the congregation. If you would like to receive the PDF via email, please contact the [church office](#). Unless you provide your name, the survey will be automatically anonymous. Please complete the questionnaire by January 16th, 2026.
- The second component of the listening process is a small-group session. Each session is limited to 12 people and will last approximately 90 minutes. These sessions will be held the week of Feb. 26-28 and will provide an opportunity for members to share their perspectives on the life of the church. Members will have a chance to sign up for a session soon.

The Restorative Circle will be held immediately after worship on Sunday, March 1. The circle process will provide an opportunity for healing and closure. It will last approximately three hours. Lunch will be provided.

A final report will be available once the process is complete.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED 2026 PIT



On the week of January 26, 2026, volunteers will conduct the Point in Time (PIT) count of those thought to be experiencing homelessness in Leon, Wakulla, Franklin, Gadsden, Liberty, Jefferson, Madison and Taylor Counties.

Volunteers will survey neighbors from sun-up to sun-down from January 27th-30th. Interviews conducted at the PIT are essential to understanding the needs of households who require social services and permanent housing. By understanding the scope of homelessness, goals can begin or be refined to end homelessness. PIT requires the commitment of over 100 volunteers.

All volunteers must attend a training to learn how to conduct surveys in a compassionate and informed manner. The volunteer training for Leon, Wakulla and Gadsden Counties will be 1/25/26 from 3-5pm. Other county trainings will be scheduled to accommodate county specific volunteers.
